FIRST

- Our school day starts at **8.35am promptly.**
- We ask parents to have children in school for 8:35am ready for registration at 8:40am
- Please do not arrive late in school as this can disrupt the class and your child's classroom routine.



Arriving at school



Staff will greet the children at the Reception gate (next to the play area) and the children will come into school independently.

Please note that the Reception gate will close at 8:45am.

If you arrive later than 8:45am you will have to drop your child at the office and sign them in.



- The collection time for Reception is **3:10pm**.
- Please wait outside of the school gate and a member of staff will bring your child to you.
- If you cannot, or are unable to, collect your child from school please ensure that you inform the class teacher or the office with the name and relationship of the person who will be collecting him/her.
- PLEASE NOTE: Children will not be released from school
 into the care of another person unless we have had
 notification from yourselves. If we cannot contact you your
 child will go into our After School Club until we can and
 there will be an £18.00 charge for this.





- If you are using a car to transport your child to school in September, please ensure that you park well away from the school and you walk the short distance into school.
- We remain very concerned about parents parking outside school causing safety issues for the children.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

Typical Day

8:35am - Children come into school 8:40-9am – Fine motor activities & Registration 9-9.30am - Phonics & Shared Reading 9:30am- Literacy carpet time 9:45-11am - Morning session 11:00am-11:30am – Maths carpet time **11.30 - 12.45pm -** Lunchtime 12:45-1pm – Topic carpet time 1.00pm to 2.30pm - Afternoon session **2:30 – 3pm –** Talk through stories **3-3.10pm** - Getting ready to go home 3:10pm – Home time



- All children are required to wear the full school uniform every day including the correct footwear – please read the Uniform Policy in your starter pack
- We <u>do not allow</u> trainers to be worn in school other than for PE.
- All school uniform items should be labelled clearly with your child's name.
- Named clothing is always returned to its owner, however, un-named clothing may be lost forever!!
- Extreme Hair Cuts / hair accessories / earrings are not allowed please read the uniform policy.





- All children in Reception and the Key Stage 1 classes have a FREE universal school meal.
- All food is cooked and prepared in our school kitchen. We serve a balanced nutritional meal which includes fresh fruit and vegetables.
- There is **NO** option to bring a packed lunch from home.
- Healthy snacks are provided and children can access this across the day in the classroom. Year 1& 2 have theirs during morning break time.
- Please send in a named bottle of water each day with your child



- The Department for Education, <u>does not</u> give any entitlement to parents to take their child on holiday or out of school during term time.
- Any application for leave of absence must be in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> and the Principal must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave of absence.

- Parents can be fined by the Local Authority for taking their child on holiday during term time without written consent from the school.
- School holiday dates can be found in your pack and on our school website.



- If your child needs medication, but is well enough to attend school, you should bring your medicine into the school office at the beginning of the day.
- You will need to complete a medication request form giving a member of staff authorisation to administer the correct dosage of medicine (These can be downloaded from the school website and either emailed in or left at the office if email is not possible.)
- The parents of children with ongoing medical needs e.g Asthma will be asked to complete a Health Care Plan.
- Please note: Only medicines prescribed by the doctor will be given in school with the exception of Calpol and Antihistamines.



- Accidents are unavoidable in any environment and sometimes happen during the school day – these are usually bumps and grazes.
- All accidents are reported and treated by our First Aid trained staff in school.
- If your child receives a bump to the head you will receive a text message inform you.
- If we feel the injury is of a more serious nature we will contact you immediately.



- We provide an early morning Breakfast Club for children in school if parents require this service.
- Breakfast Club starts at 7:30am and continues until the start of the school day with full supervision. Younger children are escorted to their classrooms by a member of our staff.
- The cost is £6.00 per day which includes a choice of healthy breakfast options.
- There is no need to book Breakfast Club and children can be dropped off in the morning. Parents will be charged on their ArborPay accounts.



- We also continue to provide afterschool care from 3:10pm 6:00pm each night.
- If you require a place for your child any time during the week, please complete the Booking Form in your welcome pack
- Cost: £13.00 per night.
- A register is sent down to the classroom each day and the children can be sent up to the club with a staff member.



- We have a Parent Teacher
 Association in school who work tirelessly to raise extra funds for the children in school.
- The PTA meet regularly and always welcome parents who would like to volunteer help in any way.
- Parent support is necessary in order for the PTA to run successfully.
 - Please try to attend the Annual General Meeting at the beginning of term.





How can parents help?

- Please get your child to be independent – **toileting,** dressing, recognising their own name
- Share information from home which may directly affect your child in school
- Read and practise keywords daily we will have a phonics workshop in the new academic year to support with this.
- Communicate via Dojo or before/ after school to your child's teachers
- Join the PTA your ideas and suggestions will be welcomed

Toileting

- Whilst some children may still require support for toileting due to medical issues when they start school, it is very important for your child to be able to use the toilet independently.
- Unlike nurseries and other early years providers, schools do not have staff available for regular nappy changing.
- If you need support with toileting, please contact your health visitor as soon as possible so that he/she can support you and your child over summer to become more independent.
- Ms Bacon has some information to support parents
